Dear College Families,

It was a great pleasure to attend the St John's ANZAC Service today held in the Performing Arts Centre. Our Guest Speaker was College parent, Lieutenant Colonel Schembri, who has a distinguished service record in the Australian Army. He has enjoyed a vast array of positions and worked in every state in Australia as well as New Zealand, Canada, Hawaii and Malaysia. Also, throughout his career, he has been deployed numerous times on overseas active service involving warlike operations, humanitarian assistance and disaster relief, border protection and national security. His most recent deployment was just last year as the Commanding Officer of the Transit Security Element on Operation RESOLUTE. Currently, he is posted as a staff officer in the Future Plans cell at Headquarters, 2nd Division in Sydney.

His address to students and visiting dignitaries about the ANZAC spirit was both moving and motivational and we thank him for the gift of his time and wisdom.

Students will also be attending services at Springfield Lakes in the Robelle Domain where Old Collegian Jessica Clune will be a part of the Catafalque party around the new memorial. Jessica has recently returned from her first deployment in Afghanistan as part of the Military Police.

At present our Future Thinkers are in Florida, USA, at the annual Conrad Spirit of Innovation Challenge, Kennedy Space Centre showcasing their solutions to real world problems. Already they have experienced the scope for innovation and entrepreneurship by networking with other semi finalists.

Prior to their departure Professor David Mee, UQ School of Mechanical and Mining Engineering, presented students with certificates acknowledging their achievements.

"It's amazing that students this young are thinking of ideas this big," Professor Mee said in a recent UQ publication.

"These are the people who will make up the next generation of scientists, engineers and mathematicians who will change this world and, who knows, maybe others.

"Engaging young people to innovate like this is vital to stimulating an interest in STEM studies at university."

The St John's students, divided into six teams, are the only Australians to make the competition. They worked through their holidays and have spent almost a year preparing ideas for the challenge.

The ideas include:

- A futuristic hand brace that would provide support while soothing arthritic pain (Team Medico).
- A mobile phone app that helps prevent the rising problem of sleep or wakefulness disorders from smart devices (Team Lumos).
- A tiny device inserted under the skin that automatically distributes medical dosages for patients with Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (Team Heilsa).
- An exoskeleton spacesuit that gives astronauts extra strength and agility while working outside their craft (Team Strike Wolf).
- An automated solution to the EpiPen, called the EpiBand, that responds with a shot of adrenalin when the wearer shows signs of anaphylactic shock (Team Asclepius).
- Tiny nanobots, called NanoBetes, that live in a diabetic's bloodstream and automatically monitor glucose levels and distribute insulin (Team MJNT).

The Hon. Leeanne Enoch MP, State Member for Algester, also attended the College prior to their departure and presented all students involved with an Ambassadors Queensland pack from the State Government.

## From the Head of Primary

Dear Parents

### Innovative Learning with the IB

In a recent online article I read from EduResearch Matters, the voice for the Australian Association for Research in Education, the authors John Fischetti and Scott Imig gave examples of what they called 'impressive innovations occurring in Australia and around the world ... offering meaningful education experiences for students'. The International Baccalaureate (IB) was one of those examples. Being a curriculum framework that emphasises world-calibrated learning engagements, problem solving and integrated skills and understanding, the IB Primary Years Program (PYP) is seen as a very innovative approach to teaching. It is wonderful that we are able to offer it at St John's.

I spent part of the recent Easter holidays attending a three day IB workshop to learn more about inquiry in the PYP and how to create environments in which learners can really thrive. Where the model of learning in the past has focused on retaining and recalling facts, completing assignments to set aside once finished and not thinking about the topics any further, a good education today must provide more.

At St John's we do provide much more. We have taken the innovative approach of blending explicit foundational teaching with an inquiry based and student centred approach to learning. We provide solid foundations in literacy and numeracy and teach our students to not only discover information and answers to questions, but to also apply the knowledge they gain in new and interesting ways. Using the International Baccalaureate PYP framework, a range of technology and collaborating in flexible learning spaces such as our recently refurbished upper primary classrooms our students are given a wonderful preparation for their secondary schooling. It really is exciting to see our students immersed in such a fabulous learning environment.

### Play Date

Parents and children in Kindergarten and Prep had a great deal of fun on Saturday 16 April when they attended a Play Date at school. It was a lovely afternoon that allowed parents to relax and enjoy one another's company while their children played together in the security of the Prep playground area. We thank Roscoe Revely, P&F representative, for organising the occasion and look forward to seeing more parents join us at the next Play Date later in the year.

## Lakeside Reflection

### ANZAC Day

You may not be aware, but 100 years ago this year in 1916, Canon David Garland, an Anglican Priest who was based in Brisbane, began the very first ANZAC Day commemorations. He was the originator of the ANZAC ceremonies and rituals which we still use today.

Canon Garland initiated the ANZAC Day march, the returned soldiers lunch, the 2 minutes' silence and the wreath laying ceremony. He created the ANZAC ceremonies in such a way that they are ecumenical and inclusive so all people could come together as one to remember those who had sacrificed their lives for their country.

Canon Garland was an army chaplain who looked after the soldiers both here in Australia and in the Middle East. Defence Force Chaplains and churches play a significant role in commemorating Australia's war efforts, particularly in those first ANZAC day services.

As an Anglican school we can be proud of our connection with those first ANZAC Day ceremonies, which to this day keep alive the memory of those men and women who gave their lives so that we may live in peace. We can be proud that each year our students take part in those ceremonies both at the School and in the Community.

## From the Deputy Head of College (Pastoral Care)

### Managing Anxiety

Anxiety is a normal part of life and can be managed, but it takes time. It's also contagious so it's the job of parents to stay calm, think clearly and role model confidence when kids get anxious so that children can learn how to cope with anxiety. Below are some guidelines for helping to ease anxiety in a child's life. They have been written by Michael Grose.

*Calm* is created through your words, voice and facial expression. When children become anxious, help them recognise what's happening. Some kids get angry, some become upset and others withdraw. Work out the pattern for your child and help them recognise when they are anxious.

*Accept* your child's anxious feelings. Your child needs to trust that you are with them, and then they will be more willing to let you help them cope. It's hard sometimes to differentiate between what may be a bad case of negative thinking and true anxiety.

*Challenge* the validity of your child's fears and anxiety, using logic and rational thinking. Don't allow kids to wallow in self-pity. Move their thoughts towards the future rather than allow them to mope around.

*Encourage* your child to overcome their anxiety through action.

Anxiety is normal, and part of everyday life. However, it can be debilitating unless it's managed. Anxiety management takes time for kids to learn, but it's one of those valuable life skills that parents can teach their kids.

### Parent Library Resources

There are a number of parenting resources available in the Secondary Campus Library. These resources are available for parents to borrow. One of the latest additions to our collection is Elizabeth Hartley-Brewer's *Raising and Praising Girls* and *Raising and Praising Boys*. It is a practical, common-sense guide which outlines the way boys and girls react to praise. Her insightful tips show parents of girls how to:

- select praise styles that will combat the perfectionism girls are often susceptible to and boost their inner confidence
- encourage their daughters to be creative and take risks
- Teach girls not to fear failure but to accept it and learn from it.

Her tips on raising boys show parents why:

- Boys need regular but small doses of positive feedback to prevent them from becoming distracted or losing focus in their work
- Sons may value their mother's opinion less than their father's
- Praise and rewards can be exploited by boys and used as bargaining tools to twist situations to their advantage

I encourage you to access these books. We will be continuing to add to our parenting resources.

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) program continues in 2016 with all students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 being assessed using common national tests in Reading, Writing, Language Conventions (Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation) and Numeracy. Our students receive focussed preparation lessons in their English and Mathematics classes as part of the programs for these subjects.

### When will the tests be held?

The tests are scheduled for the mornings of Tuesday 10 May to Thursday 12 May. All schools across Australia complete the tests on the same days. The times shown on the timetable are student working times. Extra time is given for teacher instruction.
