<p>Day 1</p>	<p>Arrival Day Be introduced to St John's staff and meet your friendly homestay family. Relax and unwind in your new home after your flight.</p>	
<p>Day 2</p>	<p>Mt Coot-tha Lookout Get your bearings and look out across the beauty of Australia's 3rd largest city, Brisbane. On a clear day you can see all the way to the bay. Great photo opportunities.</p> <p>Lone Pine Koala Sanctuary Get up close and personal with plenty of Australian animals. Cuddle a koala, feed kangaroos and talk with a cockatoo.</p> 	<p>Australian Animals</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Learn about what makes Australian animals unique through pictures, games, art and craft. Study (amongst other things) the koala, kangaroo, platypus, emu and echidna. - Learn about how to interact with the bush turkey and water dragon you will meet on the day's excursion. - Create animal art to take home with you.
<p>Day 3</p>	<p>Queensland Museum Learn about the present and past including our local animals, the Great Barrier Reef, Brisbane of old and Australian dinosaurs.</p> <p>Gallery of Modern Art There's always something interesting on display. Immerse yourself in art in the special Children's Art Centre.</p> 	<p>Australian Geography</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Be able to place major cities, states, territories and places of interest like the Great Barrier Reef and Uluru (Ayers Rock) on a map of Australia. - Learn about the meaning behind the Australian and Aboriginal flags. 



<p>Day 4</p>	<p>Queen Street Mall A chance for you to shop for souvenirs and gifts for loved ones in the heart of the city.</p> <p>Botanic Gardens Take in the lush sub-tropical quiet just moments away from the hustle and bustle of the city.</p> <p>Queensland University of Technology Science and Engineering Cube Get hands on in one of the world's largest digital interactive learning environments.</p> <p>Goodwill Bridge and Southbank Walk across the Brisbane River into Southbank. Explore the Parklands, with its lush foliage, public beach, lagoons and picnic areas.</p>	<p>Beach Culture</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Discover the role of the amazing volunteer surf lifesavers and the dos and don'ts for swimming in the ocean. 
<p>Day 5</p>	<p>The Gold Coast Feel the sand between your toes at one of Australia's most famous beaches. A wonderful spot for memorable photos.</p> <p>Seaworld, Dreamworld or Movieworld Enjoy all the fun of the thrill rides or be captivated by the live performances and animal shows.</p>	
<p>Day 6</p>	<p>Wolston House Learn about Brisbane's colonial past with a guided tour and hands on activities at this historic homestead.</p> 	<p>Australian and Brisbane history</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Learn about Australia's convict and colonial past through stories and drama.



<p>Day 7</p>	<p>Reliving your experience and graduation preparation Spend the day with your English teacher engaging in a range of activities designed to consolidate your learning throughout the study tour. Prepare a presentation to staff and your homestay families as part of your graduation ceremony that afternoon. At lunch, enjoy a barbecue hosted by the International student prefects.</p>	<p>Art</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Put together a collage of your Australian experience; or - Say thank you to your homestay by creating for them a personal thank you card. <p>Graduation preparation Learn a song, poem or story to present in your graduation ceremony.</p>
<p>Day 8</p>	<p>Free day with homestay A chance for you to spend a day with your host families. Homestay families will show you their way of life. This may include playing sports, attending a church service, swimming, picnics and barbecues, shopping, visiting relatives or day trips to other areas of interest.</p>
