Dear Parents

I recently attended the biennial Anglican Schools ASCENT Conference where I heard a range of interesting presentations. One of the speakers was internationally renowned author, John Marsden, whose long list of books include, 'Tomorrow When the War Began' and 'Rabbits'. John spoke to us about harnessing imagination and suggested that children often lose their creative and imaginative thought as they grow older.

He suggested that when we always laugh at our young children's cute and funny answers to questions this can, over time, have an impact on their imagination. Children use their imagination in response to questions because they don't always know the answers. Not wanting to look silly in front of adults, children may choose to refrain from answering questions and sharing their imaginative thoughts. While I am not sure that this is entirely correct, I do believe we need to encourage curiosity and wonder in children so that they increase their imagination and creativity over time.

In an environment where there is one right answer for most things and the focus is on only 'getting everything correct', creativity can be stifled. Children need a learning environment that provides ample opportunity for asking questions and thinking deeply about concepts and issues. They need to use their imagination to create and solve problems. They need opportunities to explore, experiment and investigate. A PYP classroom allows these things to occur and encourages students to ask questions and then ask more. Inquiry in the PYP doesn't look for the one right answer, but instead generates further avenues for wonder, imagination and the development of deep understanding. It is a great place to learn.

Premier's Reading Challenge

St John's Anglican College will again be participating in the Premier's Reading Challenge. The Challenge, now in its eleventh year, is an initiative of the Queensland Government which is aimed at helping to improve children's literacy by boosting the number of books they read, and encouraging more challenging texts.



The Premier's Reading Challenge recognises the range of student abilities. All students are encouraged to participate because the Challenge is not a competition, but a way to encourage greater involvement and develop a love of reading for life. It is recommended for students generally in **Prep to Grade 4 to read or engage in 20 books**. For our younger students home readers can be used to complete their reading record. Engaging with a book can include at-home activities such as shared reading, listening and reading along with a book, or being read to. **Years 5 - 6 are recommended to read 15 books**, and these can include books read at home or in class.

Each student will be issued with a Reading Record sheet. Each book that they read or engage in should be recorded on this sheet. Once the required number of books has been recorded, the sheet can be handed into your child's teacher straight away.

All children who take up the challenge and read the required number of books will receive a signed certificate from the Premier. The Reading Challenge begins on the **Monday May 16 and runs until the Friday 26 August 2016**.

As reading is a critical part of each student's development it would be a great idea to support your child's involvement in this challenge. It will be a wonderful opportunity to help foster their love of reading.
